AN ORDINANCE AND JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AND THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS AUTHORIZING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE VILLAGE BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND CLERK/TREASURER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH NORTH AMERICAN SALT FOR THE PURCHASE OF SALT FOR WATER TREATMENT PURPOSES AND DECLARING THE SAME TO BE AN EMERGENCY.


WHEREAS, council of the Village of Lodi and the Lodi Board of Public Affairs of Lodi, Medina County, Ohio, has determined that it will require salt for water treatment purposes for the upcoming year; and

WHEREAS, both council and the Lodi Board of Public Affairs has advertised for bids and has reviewed the proposals of various salt companies; and


WHEREAS, North American Salt, has submitted a bid of \$68.56 per ton to be delivered F.O.B. Water Plant at Lodi, Ohio in quantities of not less than 24 tons; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OBDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO THAT:


1. It is deemed necessary that the Village of Lodi, through its Board of Public Affairs purchase its water treatment salt for a period of one (1) year as stated above, thereby securing the advantages of competitive bidding.
2. The Board is authorized, through the Superintendent, to enter into a contract with North American Salt for salt, depending on Board requirements of Southern Course Rock Salt for water treatment purposes, to be delivered F.O.B. Water Plant in Lodi, Ohio, the same being determined by the Board of Public Affairs to be the lowest and best bid for a prices of \$68.56 per ton in quantities of not less than 24 tons.
3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the preservation of the public health and safety, the emergency being manifested in the need for constant and uninterrupted supply of treated water for the inhabitants of the Village of Lodi and therefore shall go into immediate effect upon its passage, provided it receives the required vote as an emergency measure.
