AN ORDINANCE AND JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AND THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS AUTHORIZING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH STEVENS PAINTON CORP. FOR THE PROVISION OF A FIFTY TON SALT STORAGE TANK FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Council and the Board of Public Affairs previously authorized the Clerk to advertise for bids for a fifty ton salt storage tank for the water treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, from the bids received, it has been determined with approval from the Village Engineer the bid of Stevens Painton Corp. is the lowest and best bid; and

WHEREAS, Council and the Lodi Board of Public Affairs now desire to authorize the Superintendent of Board of Public Affairs to enter into a contract for the provision of said fifty ton salt storage tank for the water treatment plant with Stevens Painton Corp.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, OHIO AND THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS:


SECTION 1. The bid of Stevens Painton Corp. for the provision of a fifty ton salt storage tank for the water treatment plant is hereby determined by Council and the Lodi Board of Public Affairs to be the lowest and best bid of the bids received.


SECTION 2. The Superintendent of the Lodi Board of Public Affairs is authorized and to enter into a contract with Stevens Painton Corp. for the provision of a fifty ton salt storage tank for the water treatment plant at a price not to exceed \$133,528.75. Said contract is attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.



This Ordinance and Joint Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of Lodi; the specific reason for the emergency being the immediate need to continue to provide safe water service to the Village of Lodi and its water customers and therefore this Ordinance and Joint Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.




