**AN ORDINANCE AND JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AND THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2506 ADOPTING FLOOD DAMAGE REGULATIONS AND REVIEW SYSTEMS APPLICABLE TO SAID REGULATIONS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, Medina County, Ohio has adopted National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) regulations in order to participate in NFIP programs; and

WHEREAS, Medina County, Ohio has requested that the Village of Lodi also adopt said regulations in order to participate in NFIP programs and permit the Medina County Engineer to act as Flood Plan Administrator within the Village of Lodi; and

WHEREAS, Council and the Lodi Board of Public Affairs of the Village of Lodi has adopted said regulations, permitted the Medina County Engineer to administrate said regulations within the Village of Lodi, and appointed the Superintendent of the Board of Public Affairs to administer a program to minimize infiltration into the Village water system and discharges from the Village water and sanitary sewer systems into flood waters; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has requested that original flood damage reduction regulations be amended and is requiring the Village to approve said amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AND THE LODI BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS that:


1. The Amended flood damage reduction regulations attached hereto and made a part hereof and marked Exhibit A are hereby adopted and approved.
2. The Medina County Engineer is hereby designated as Flood Plan Administrator and is hereby permitted to administer and implement these regulations.
3. The Superintendent of the Lodi Board of Public Affairs is hereby designated to administer a program to require new or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewer systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into said system and discharges from the systems into flood waters and require on-site sewage disposal system to be located to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding.
4. This ordinance and resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and the benefit of the Village of Lodi and its inhabitants; the specific reason for the emergency being the need to immediately adopt amended regulations to avoid contamination of water supplies from flooding, and therefore shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.






