Ordinance No. 2676-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO URGING THE DEFEAT OF THE PROPOSAL CALLED THE TAX EXPENDITURE LIMITATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


WHEREAS, A proposal has been placed on the November general election ballot, whereby Ohio voters will determine whether to implement the Tax Expenditure Limitation, which would limit local government spending for all funds to an annual rate of growth equal to the consumer price index plus the rate of population change or 3.5%; and


WHEREAS, Village of Lodi feels that this proposal will be devastating to continuation of local public services including utilities.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO THAT:

1. The Village of Lodi hereby opposes the proposal called the Tax Expenditure Limitation and urges its defeat November general election as it is detrimental to the welfare of the citizens of Village of Lodi, Ohio.
2. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the Village of Lodi and its inhabitants; the specific reason for the emergency being the immediate need to urge the defeat of Tax Expenditure Limitation proposal that could be devastating to the provision of local public services including utilities within the Village of Lodi and therefore this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
