

Ordinance No. 2692-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO AMENDING THE LODI RESCUE DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH REGULATIONS TO DEFINE AN ACTIVE MEMBER AND AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2668-06 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Village of Lodi has previously established Lodi Rescue Department Rules and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, Council now desires to amend the previously established ordinance and enact a new ordinance to determine the definition of an "Active Member" of the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LODI, MEDINA COUNTY, OHIO THAT:

1. Ordinance No. 2668-06 is hereby amended as follows:
2. "Active Member" for the Lodi Rescue Department shall be defined as an EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic of the Lodi Rescue Department who makes a minimum of twelve (12) calls per quarter and attends 70% of all regularly scheduled Lodi Rescue meetings and training sessions in a three (3) month period beginning July 1, 2006. Probationary EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic must attend 100% of all regularly scheduled Lodi Rescue meetings and training sessions during the probationary period.
3. Beginning July 1, 2006, training records and call records shall be reviewed at the first Officer's Meeting of each quarter by the Officers of the Department. Any EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic not complying with the requirements set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be immediately removed as an "Active Member" of the Department for a period of three (3) months. Any probationary EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic not complying with the requirements set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be immediately removed from the Department.
4. During the three (3) month period that any EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic is removed as an active member of the Department, any inactive EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic shall attend Seventy (70%) of all regularly scheduled Lodi Rescue Meetings and Training Sessions during the three (3) month period. If any inactive EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic fails to attend Seventy (70%) percent of all regularly scheduled Lodi Rescue Meetings and Training Sessions during the three (3) month period, the inactive EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic shall be immediately removed from the Department.
5. The Chief of the Lodi Rescue Department shall post an "Active Member" and "Inactive Member" list immediately following the first Officer's Meeting of each quarter at the Rescue Department Headquarters. The Chief of the Lodi Rescue Department shall also notify any EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic who is not an active member of the Department, or who has been removed from the Department in a writing mailed to the last known address of the EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic kept in the payroll records of the Village with a copy to the Village Safety Director.
6. Any EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic who is unable to comply with the requirements of Section 2 of this Ordinance may request a leave in writing from the Lodi Rescue Chief. Any leave requested must be approved in writing by the Lodi Rescue


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
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Chief in order to be effective. All requests for leave and approvals or denials of leave shall be retained in the employee's personnel file. Any EMT-Basic, EMT-Intermediate and EMT-Paramedic on the "Inactive Member" list and subject to a Physical and/or Training Expense Contract attached as Exhibit "A" to Ordinance No. 2668-06 shall have the contract term extended for the length of the inactive period.

7. Any provision of Ordinance No. 2668-06 not herein modified shall remain in full force and effect.
8. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and welfare of the Village of Lodi and its inhabitants; the specific reason for the emergency being the immediate need to revise the "Active Member" policy, and therefore this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
